



The centre is named Malsawm Ability Resources Centre (MARC) and is the focal point in supporting its various components namely The Malsawm Initiative (A School for Children with Special Needs), Early Intervention, Therapeutic Service, Home Based Care, Community Based Rehabilitation, Training and Capacity Building, Advocay & Empowerment.



Tina Ngaisanching



Born 3 months earlier than the expected delivery date, Ngaisanching@Tina was in intensive care before she could be taken home. Her development was slow as it took her 2 years to sit without support and speak her first word after 3 years of birth. She was taken to the doctor after her 4th birthday and it was then her parents found out she was born with Cerebral Palsy (CP).

In 2016, at the age of 6, she got admitted at The Malsawm Initiative (TMI). Tina is a cheerful girl who loves going to school, studying and mingling with others socially. Even though she is slow in learning and writing, she never failed to do her assignments. She was unable to stand or walk without support as she could not control her limbs properly. When she first joined TMI, she was unable to sit on a wheelchair. With regular Physiotherapy on weekly basis and guidance from the special educators she started using wheelchair in the school premises with her 1 year completion of joining the school. Within the second year of her schooling she started using rollator without support and on her third year she started standing and walking on her own. This is a breakthrough for Tina within her years of struggle, even though she still needs support from friends, families and teachers, she got a step closer to a full independent life ahead of her. Now 10 years old, Tina believes a day will come when she will be able to walk and stand on her own like everyone else.





Continuing children education:

The Malsawm Initiative students continuing classes online and learning various life skills with assistance from parents, siblings and teachers despite COVID-19 lockdown. We thank all the parents and siblings for their effortless support and tirelessly sparing their time in becoming the hands and eyes for the teachers in training and teaching the students.




Tyson Lungousang Singson

Hello, This is Tyson. His story of struggling with disability and overcoming his inability - from wheelchair on his way to an independent life is both inspiring and encouraging to all. A 11 yr old boy with cerebral palsy hails from K Salbung village within Churachandpur district, Manipur. He spent his entire childhood on a wheelchair. He joined The Malsawm Initiative (TMI) when it initially started in 2011. He took a couple of years break and again joined the school. His condition is severe and he is unable to stand or move around without the help of a wheelchair.

After 11 years of attempt with continuous guidance and Physiotherapy sessions conducted at MARC, he successfully stood up on his legs without the help of a wheelchair. His parents were trained and guided by our physiotherapist online during this lockdown.

We are proud and happy with his marvellous achievement and wish him both health and the will to go forward in life.

COVID RESPONSE

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT & PROTECTIVE GEARS:



A drive for distribution of protective gears - masks. gloves and hand sanitizers was conducted at the District CMO's office, Casualty, Isolation ward, Medical Superintendent's office, Police Department, Community Mobilizer and more than 54 Community Quarantine Centres and Institutional Quarantine Centres. While also donating 2 unit of Oxygen Concentrator to the District Hospital, a total of 7730 pcs of face masks, 4000 pcs of gloves, 100 pcs of face shield, 120 btls of sanitizer, 1 pcs fumigator, 4 units handwashing stand, 30 units of oximeter, and 15 units of BP apparatus and handwashing facilities installed at four locations. All these activities were carried out during the first wave of the pandemic in 2020.

CAPACITY BUILDING & SENSITIZATION:

With the initiative from CCI in collaboration with District Administration and the CMO Office conducted various training on SOP (Standard **Operating** Procedures) for Volunteers of Community Quarantine Centres (CQC) across the district. We provided training to 46 CQCs so far. Another challenge that we faced is on Standard Operating Procedure for Dead Body Management (COVID-19) as dead management by local philantrophic and cementery board. We provide training to more than 50 cemetery board in and around Lamka town.





AWARENESS

With the pandemic transforming lives in profound ways, affecting people of all ages, all walks of life, the compulsion of reaching every home, every individual has driven CCI to prepare six Covid-19 Awareness Videos in different local dialects with Sign Language and English subtitles. These videos includes a basic awareness campaign on Covid-19, What Coronavirus is and its symptoms, how it spreads and its prevention, myths and facts about it, the importance of social distancing and home quarantine.





HUMANITARIAN RELIEF:

The battle against the invisible virus, Covid-19 is ongoing and very much at large, putting the normal functioning of livelihood nearly at a halt with the lockdown and curfews imposed during the first wave till date in the state to prevent the further spreading of the Covid-19. This has affected many households and families of the poorer sections of the community suffers with the sudden hike in prices of livestock. So, CCI identified more than 885 household/family of





Persons with Disability, Women Vegetable Vendor and Daily Wagers in and around Lamka Town. These extremely needful families were provided with Dry Ration Kits. A total of 21700 kg of rice, 1165ltrs. Of Cooking Oil, 1165 kg of Dal, 868 kg Salt, 1341 kg of Potatoes, 994 kg of Onion, 697 kg of Peas, 697 kg of Milk Powder, 697 kg of Sugar, 800 units of Soap, 4000 pcs of Surgical Masks and 400 Hand Sanitizers were distributed.

Apart from the dry rations, GiveIndia also allows us to implement a One Time Direct Transfer Campaign, amounting to Rs. 4000 per family to lighten the hardships faced by the lower society, making sure they are protected from starvation. The project was benefited by 250 families in and around Lamka Town.

DEVELOPMENT/LIVELIHOOD

In order to revive and rejuvenate springs which are lifeline of the North Eastern Region (NER) especially in hilly region and to minimize the adverse impact of climate change on water availability both for human consumption and irrigation, especially during off-season, NABARD has launched an innovative and integrated springshed-based watershed development programme in the NER, including Sikkim, on a pilot basis with financial support under WDF since January 2017. Centre for Community Initiative was selected as a Project Implementing Agency (PIA) to implement the project in Kangkap Village, Suangdoh TD Block. Currently, Kangkap village is in PIP (Project Implement Phase).


