Early Education Section II is an inclusive space for children aged 4 to 8, including those with Autism, hearing impairments, cerebral palsy, locomotor disabilities, and multiple disabilities. It fosters an accessible and welcoming environment that celebrates each child's uniqueness.

Daily visual schedules motivate students, while assembly and circle time build social skills. Teaching strategies like hand-over-hand support, pretend play, sign language, and multi-sensory approach cater to diverse developmental needs. Depending upon the students strength an Individualize Education Plans (IEPs) are customized for each student's goals.
