Advancing Inclusive Education in Mainstream Schools

As part of the Inclusive School Programme under the Making **Education Accessible for All** (MEAL) project, supported by the Wipro Foundation, the MEAL team recently took a significant step forward. Following permission from the CEO, ADC/CCpur, the MEAL Coordinator and ISP/MEAL Coordinator met with Mr. H. Paokhothang, Inspector Schools, ADC/CCpur, to discuss the program's implementation in mainstream primary co-ed schools.

During the meeting, the Inspector of Schools selected two Upper Primary Schools under the Churachandpur Block to pilot the initiative and promptly issued an order for their inclusion. This marks a vital milestone in creating a more inclusive education system and ensuring that every child has access to quality education.

The Hello Project – Shaping Sound Into Speech

In collaboration with CCI, **.Monks** is in the process of developing an AI powered text-to-speech application to provide non-verbal speech-impaired children and people their own voice. The project will use voice recognition technology to simply record their sound, and its tone and texture into a microphone. AI will analyse the sound and convert it into vocalization in the user's voice with fully articulated speech at the input of text. It will be a one-time capture to convert their sound into vocals and use it to communicate with their families & friends.
