Meet our student



Ginmuansang is an 11-year-old student with Hearing Impairment enrolled at TMI in Level A (NIOS Classes I-III). Prior to admission, he had no exposure to sign language and used gestures to communicate, which limited his social interaction with peers.

Since joining TMI, he has shown steady progress. He now uses sign language effectively to communicate with teachers, peers, and family members. His academic skills have improved, and he is able to understand instructions, read simple words, write with support, and perform basic addition and subtraction.

He also demonstrates improved independence and social skills. He participates in classroom routines, completes assigned duties, initiates communication, and shows care and cooperation with peers.

Awareness on Neurodiversity



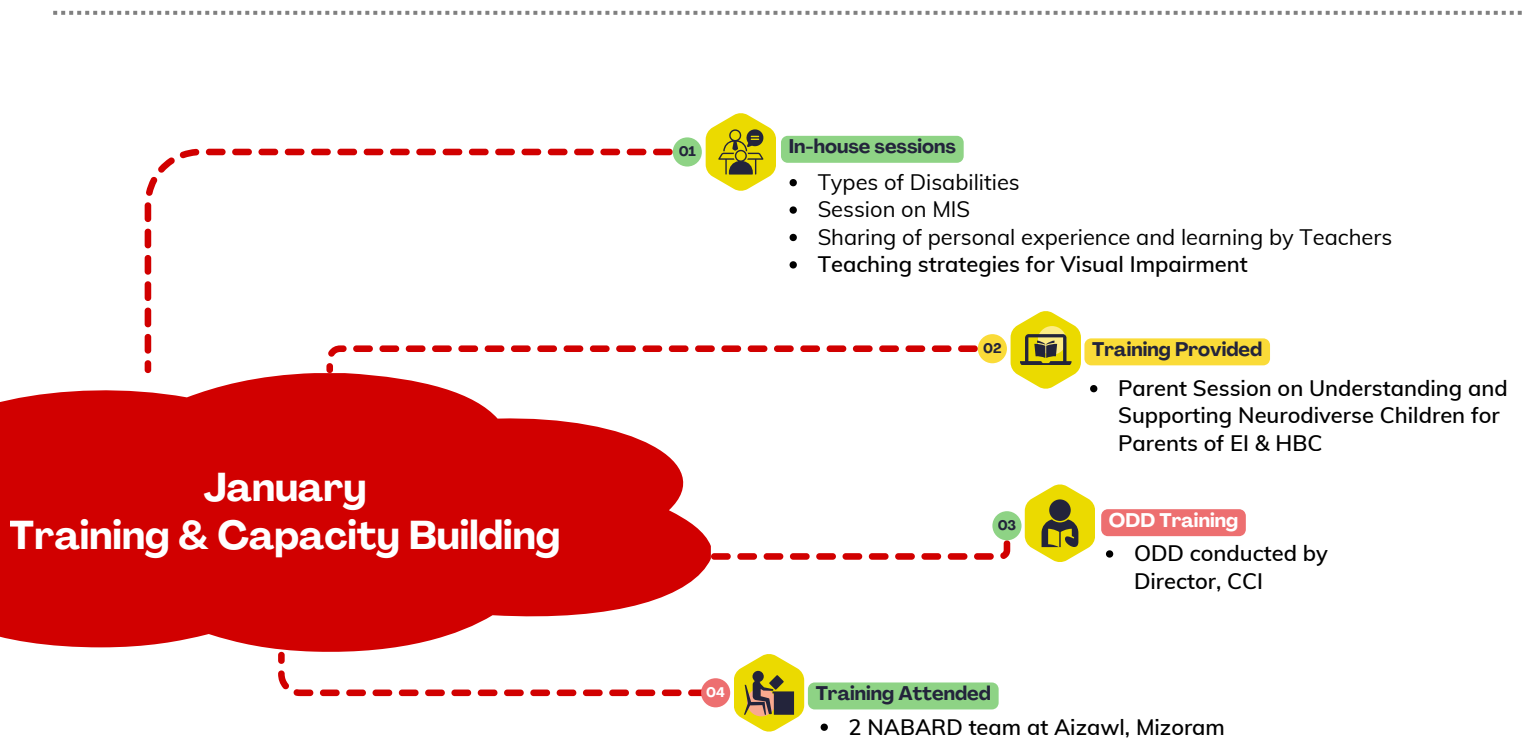
